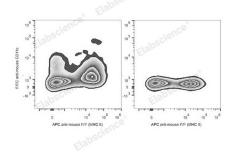

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### **Background**

CD11c is a 150 kD glycoprotein also known as  $\alpha X$  integrin, CR4, and p150. CD11c forms a  $\alpha X\beta2$  heterodimer with  $\beta2$  integrin (CD18). It is primarily expressed on dendritic cells, NK cells, a subset of intestinal intraepithelial lymphocytes (IEL), and some activated T cells. The  $\alpha X\beta2$  integrin plays an important role in cell-cell contact by binding its ligands: iC3b, fibrinogen and CD54.
