





Background

PDHA2 (Pyruvate Dehydrogenase E1 Subunit Alpha 2) is a Protein Coding gene. Diseases associated with PDHA2 include Spermatogenic Failure 1. Among its related pathways are Glucose metabolism and Citrate cycle (TCA cycle). Gene Ontology (GO) annotations related to this gene include oxidoreductase activity, acting on the aldehyde or oxo group of donors, disulfide as acceptor and pyruvate dehydrogenase (acetyl-transferring) activity. An important paralog of this gene is PDHA1.
