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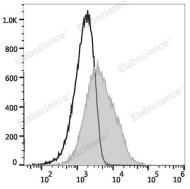

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CD38 is a 45 kD type II transmembrane glycoprotein also known as T10. It is an ADPribosyl hydrolase expressed at variable levels on hematopoietic cells and in some nonhematopoietic tissues (such as brain, muscles, and kidney). In humans, it is expressed at high levels on plasma cells and activated T and B cells. By functioning as both a cyclase and a hydrolase, CD38 mediates lymphocyte activation, adhesion, and the metabolism of cADPR and NAADP. CD31 is the ligand of CD38.
